


- 1. Application Fee Alveria will waive the application fee for sturb its who apply at Alveria pusuant to this Agreement.

Traditional/Residential Programs (imReading PA): The following scholarships are given to qualified full-time undergraduated by time students transferring from DCCC for work to ward their first backelor's degree Cumulative GPA includes DCCC and any other colleges/universities attended

- Provost Scholarship \$21,000 scholarship= member of Phi Theta Kappa or mn PIK student with final complative GPA of 35 or higher.
- Bernardine Scholarship \$19000 scholarship = final cumulative GPA between 325 and 349

To facilitate the transfer of DCCC gad rates to Alverria in accordance with the foregoing grantee, the parties agree to the following

Obligations of Alvernia University.

- 1. Participate instudent outreach (e.g.: transfer fairs, DCCC campus visits, virtual open houses, etc.) at least twice each fall and spring senester:
- 2 Invite DCCC students to an informational meeting with Alvenia faculty and staff con a regular basis at both DCCC and Alvenia in order to facilitate smooth curicular and co curicular integration into Alvenia
- 3 Send an Alvenia University Letter of Acceptance to all DCCC students who complete an application and who neet the conditions set forth in this Agreement. DCCC students who complete the Alvenia University Application will be required to follow and satisfy all Alvenia

Revision Reneval and Termination of this Agreement

The Provost at Alvenia University and the Vice President of Academic Affairs at Delavare County Community College or their designes, are responsible for identifying and communicating to each other; charges in the policies or requirements of their respective institutions that affect this Agreement.

Malfications to the terms and conditions of this Agreement may only be made by written agreement of the parties. Until such malfication by mutual written agreement, the then current terms of the Agreements hall remain in effect.

This Agreement will be ineffect as of the date of its signing for students entering Alvenia on or after Spring 2024, and will continue ineffect for five (5) years unless of the wise modified or terminated in accordance with this Agreement. Either institution may terminate this Agreement at any time by written notice at least one year in advance of the effective date of terminated it is undestood that students already accepted to Alvenia through the effective date of termination will continue to receive the benefits acticulated in this Agreement.

Provided that all parties execute a copy of this Agreement, this Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original, and all of which together shall constitute one and the same document. This Agreement may be executed by the parties and transmitted by facsimile or electronic transmission, and, if so executed and transmitted, shall be effective as if the parties had delivered an executed original of this Agreement.

Prelicersure BSN Guidelines

Students wishing to transfer to Alvenia University from another institution of higher education must meet the general admission requirements of Alvenia and have an inimum cumulative GPA of 30 A grade of C+ of higher is expected for transfer science courses. Students may not have repeated any required science courses are not transfer as they have attended including Alvenia.

Transferstudents who have completed at least 30 cedits of college level work, including the prescribed science cross for the first year, may be digible to transfer at the sophomore level. To be digible for a chrission to and placement in the rusing program at the sophomore level, applicants must complete all general achrission requirements, and

 gades of C+ or higher are ordinarily required for admission. Grades and credits from
